WOMEN AND MINORITIES IN ARTIST OCCUPATIONS

Data obtained from American artists in the 1980 Census of Population shows that both women and minorities increased their participation in the American artist labor force between 1970 and 1980. Gains by women were most spectacular. Their numbers increased at a rate of growth over twice as great as men. The 1980 data shows an increase of 162% over the number of women artists in 1970, while men increased 53%.

- o Women increased their numbers in the artist labor force by 253,901 persons from 1970 to 1980, a 162% gain over the 157,165 women artists in 1970. Men increased their numbers in the artist occupations by the smaller number of 232,726 persons in the same period. They had a much greater 1970 base of 441,901, but increased by only 53%.
- o In terms of rates of growth, women artists increased at an annually compounded rate of 10.09% during the decade, while men in the artist occupations increased at a rate of only 4.32%. As a result, women in the artist occupations in 1980 constituted 37.9% of the total artist labor force compared with 26.2% in 1970.
- o The increase of 11.7 percentage points in the proportion of women artists in the artist labor force between 1970 and 1980 was two and a half times greater than the 4.5% increase in the proportion of women in all occupations of the U.S. civilian labor force during this same time period.
- o In 1970, five states had a smaller than 20% proportion of women artists in their artist labor forces. These five states were: New Mexico, New Hampshire, Vermont, North Dakota and Wyoming. By 1980, there were no states that had a smaller proportion of women artists in their artist labor forces than 30%.
- o Hawaii, with 35.5% women artists in 1970, had the greatest proportion in its artist labor force. By 1980, 45 states exceeded the 1970 top state's proportion of women in their artist labor forces. The leading state in terms of the proportion of women in its 1980 artist labor force was Iowa with 45.3% women artists. 21 other states had 40% or more women artists in their 1980 artist labor forces.
- o Minority artists' participation in the American artist labor force increased by 2.6 percentage points between 1970 and 1980. Increases in participation were roughly the same for the three minority groups considered in this Research Division Note: Black artists (+.9%); Hispanic artists (+1.0%); Other Minority artists (mostly Asian American and Native American) (+.8%).
- o The proportion of men to women is greater in the minority groups than for all artists. For all minorities, the proportions are 68.5% men and 31.5% women. For the individual minority groups, the proportions are: Black-men 68.4%, women 31.6%; Hispanic--men 70.4%, women 29.6%; Other minorities--men 65.7%, women 34.3%.

- o In 1980, minorities were slightly under-represented in the artist occupations at 10.7%, when compared to their 11.6% participation in the broader group of managerial and professional occupations as a whole. The 4.3% Black artists in the artist labor force was below the 6.0% of this minority in the total managerial and professional labor force. However, Hispanic artists, at 3.9% of the artist labor force, were in a greater proportion than the 3.0% Hispanic persons in the managerial and professional labor force. Other Minority artists, at 2.6% of the artist labor force, were at the same proportion as this minority group in the managerial and professional labor force.
- o New York is the leading state in the number of Black artists with 7,981 in its artist labor force. However, Louisiana and Mississippi have greater concentrations of Black artists in their artist labor forces. In these two states, the total of Black artists, 1,403 and 666 respectively, comprise 10.9% and 10.8% of the total artist labor force compared with 5.8% in New York. The District of Columbia is best compared with cities rather than states. However, its 1,508 Black artists comprise 24.1% of DC's total artist labor force.
- o California is the leading state in numbers of Hispanic artists with 13,279, comprising 7.5% of the artist labor force. Four states have greater concentrations of Hispanic artists in their artist labor forces than California although the numbers are smaller. These are: Texas, 6,007 (9.7%); Florida, 4,603 (9.5%); Arizona, 1,233 (8.8%); and New Mexico, 1,187 (18.2%).
- o The distribution pattern of artists of Other Minorities, primarily Asian Americans and Native Americans, differs from Black and Hispanic artists. Only four states have more than 1,000 artists in the Other Minorities. California is the leading state with 10,084, comprising 5.7% of its artist labor force. Hawaii with its 2,921 artists in the Other Minorities group, has the greatest concentration (43.3%) of these artists. Other states with substantial numbers of artists in the group are: New York, 3,521 (2.5%) and Illinois, 1,358 (2.7%).

Caveats: The data in this Research Division Note and accompanying tables are based on the counts of the total artist labor force made in the 1980 Census. The occupations included are: authors, designers, musicians/composers, actors/directors, painters/sculptors, craft artists and artist printmakers, photographers, dancers, performers not elsewhere classified, radio/TV and other announcers, architects, and teachers of art, drama and music in higher education. The total artist labor force includes employed and unemployed artists according to standard definitions. Data in this Note should not be compared directly with Research Division Report #7, Minorities and Women in the Arts: 1970. Corresponding data from the 1980 Census has not yet been released by the Bureau of the Census. More detailed information will be made available about the subjects of this Research Division Note in future publications. Special technical problems preclude direct comparisons of minority artists and of minorities in the managerial and professional occupations as a whole for 1980 and 1970. These problems will be considered in more detail in a forthcoming Research Division Report.
